It was to a very ordinary group of shepherds looking after their sheep on a Judean hillside that an angel appeared with an astonishing message: *“Do not be afraid. The Annual General Meeting of the Kirkintilloch and Lenzie Christian Aid Group has not yet taken place but there is one definite date for your diaries.

The Christian Aid Spring Fair will be held on Saturday, 7th March 2020 in St. Mary's Church Hall and it is the turn of St. Columba's to organise the Tea Room. The Tea Room is always busy so we will need as many volunteers as possible to help on the day. The Tea Room opens at 10.00 a.m. but there is an hour's work to set up before hand. We will also need donations of baking – fruit loaves; scones; tray bakes; pancakes etc.

Other events in the fund raising calendar are the Annual Service which usually takes place at the end of April, The Erskine Bridge Cross Walk at the beginning of May and Christian Aid Week which is usually mid May. Once we have had the AGM I will publish these dates in the next Magazine.

This year Christian Aid Scotland is undertaking a special Christmas Appeal to help mothers use their God-given gifts to escape poverty for example by providing them with sewing materials or tools for farming. You can donate to this appeal on the Christian Aid website at www.christianaid.org.uk.

The current issue of the Christian Aid Magazine can be found on the table at the rear of the Church or it is available on their website. There are now two issues a year Autumn/Winter and Spring/Summer. Only one paper copy is now sent to the Church in the interests of the environment but I am able to order more paper issues if they are requested.

May I take this opportunity to thank all of you who have donated so generously to Christian Aid throughout 2019 and helped out at the Fair last March. Your kindness really does make a difference to many poor communities in the world.

In conclusion may I wish you all a very happy and peaceful Christmas as we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus and enjoy the Festive Season.

Hall Toilets

Many thanks to all who contributed so generously to the recent Gift Day to help raise funds to put towards new toilets for the halls. A total of £4902 has been given and gift aid tax rebates of £945 will take this to £5847. When this is added to the sum of £2566 that has already been donated for new toilets (£900 from the Men's Group and £1666 from Oasis) there is then a very sizeable total of £8413 to put towards this work.

The Board will now discuss how best to take this work forward at its December meeting. Once again, thank you for such a generous response to this appeal.

Our annual quiz was next on the syllabus, a fun evening guaranteed by our genial, but firm Quizmaster Allan. We enjoyed having Melanie Brickley visit in November when she told us of her involvement with 'Women Make Heritage'. There has been an excellent exhibition of this in our newly restored Town Hall and there are plans afoot for a theatrical version in the Town Hall next Spring.

Prior to our break we shall have our visit from Chryston Men's Club and then our Billy Paterson Memorial evening.

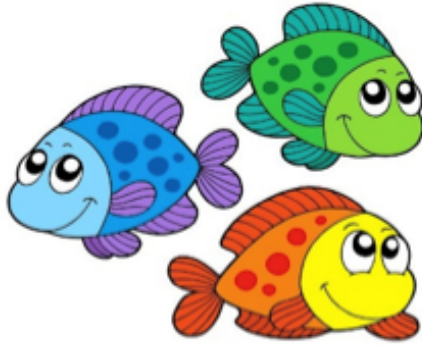
It has been very heartening to report an increase in our membership and also a high turnout each week.
