

From the Manse

For man at war with man hears not The love-song which they bring

I must have sung these lines from 'It came upon the midnight clear' every year of my life for as long as I can remember. I expect many of us have. However, it seems they ring true particularly clearly this Advent season. Last Christmas, there was the reality of war in Europe once again with the Russian invasion of Ukraine in February 2022. This year, there is the added sorrow of the Israel-Gaza war. Can there really be peace on earth?

The Gospel-writer John says of Jesus stepping on to the stage of human history, '...though the world was made through him, the world did not recognise Him' (John 1:10). This is why the arrival of Jesus, the Prince of Peace, has not yet ushered in an era of universal peace: even today, many remain untouched by his coming.

Even so, there is great hope in John's gospel. Jesus, who is the light of the world, '...shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it' (John 1:5). Today, Jesus shines in the lives of His disciples. Even where that light is a flicker, the darkness cannot put it out. We may feel there is little we can do to dispel the darkness in the world today. But if we are truly shining with Jesus' light, we brighten that part of the world where God has set us. If we are at peace with God, we spread something of His peace around us.

I love the way 'It came upon the midnight clear' ends. It ends with a picture of that great day when God will wind up human history, and when there will be a new earth and a new sky. On that day, Jesus the Prince of Peace will reign as never before. After that day, there will be no night - for all who trust in Him. Until that day, God calls us to shine like stars and to share His light.

Remembering Anna Mackenzie 3 May 1949 - 21 February 2023

Anna was brought up in the West End of Glasgow and we met in March 1970 and got engaged on Christmas Day that year, thereafter marrying in September 1972 at St Christopher's Parish Church, Househillwood, where we had become members, whilst I was helping out friends running the Junior Section of the BB Company there.

Our first 4 years of married life were spent living in Shawlands before moving to Muirside Avenue, Kirkintilloch after the birth of Scott a few months previously and we joined St Columba's in 1976.

Like many new Mums of that era, Anna had given up work to bring up Scott and then his sister Lynne and brother Craig.

If I was to sum up Anna's life in a few words it would have to be 'carer extraordinaire'.

She had wanted to follow a career path in nursing, but her mother had not approved.

Not long after we arrived in Rosebank and with a young child, we got to hear about a 'babysitting circle' which involved residents in the area who babysat each others kids to let parents have an occasional night out. A token system was in operation, whereby when you took a turn you would be credited with tokens, which would then in turn let you use them for a night out.

That was perhaps just the beginning for Anna's 'caring path', as she then went to help run the Waterside Playgroup in the Waterside Miners' Club and it thereafter relocated to St Columba's Church Hall where many in the Church will remember her from.

Anna would go on to care for both her Mother and her Aunt Lexie, the latter moving out to Kirkintilloch and staying at the Bield Housing Complex in Lammermoor Road.

Remembering Anna Mackenzie 3 May 1949 - 21 February 2023. (cont'd)

Following on from the birth of our third child Craig, Anna spent many months over several years taking care of his needs both during hospitalisation and long spells at home in his early school years.

With primary school hours being worked around for Craig, Anna took on a part - time post running the 'Hillhead Pre Five Unit' located in the Annexe at Hillhead Primary School in Kirkintilloch.

So from having a dream to be a nurse, Anna ended up not only devoting her time to bringing up our family, but caring for many other children and elderly relatives.

More recently Anna herself was the one who latterly required a lot of care from myself and family, but also from many health professionals over a seventeen month period.

It was near the end of that period that I had occasion to be discussing Anna's situation with Philip and arranging for a hospital visit for Anna, that she got to hear from staff in the ward that Philip had called. She then phoned me to say "Philip has been on the phone about coming up to the hospital,That's great, I would like that.......I really like the guy!".

I think Anna's words really do sum up what a lot of people think about how blessed we are to have Philip and his family with us at St Columba's Hillhead.

Our family certainly do and have to thank Philip once more for making Anna's funeral service in March so memorable. Many folk have since commented on how special that occasion was for those who managed to attend.

Thanks for the support and warmth from St Columba's Hillhead.


Whilst we do hope you will be able to attend these services in person, it is our intention to also make all the services from the St Columba's site available online via the church website and YouTube channel.

Christian Aid Report Winter 2023

The total raised by our local group of churches during Christian Aid Week was £4,344.44 of which £1,491.00 was Gift Aided.

The next combined fund raising event was the Christmas Café which took place in St. Mary's Church Hall on Saturday, 18th November and raised a total of £1,070.00 for CA.

Christian Aid's Christmas Appeal this year highlights the work of young women in Northern Bangladesh who have come together with the help of Christian Aid to sell their homemade quilts and craftwork online. The climate crisis is impacting adversely traditional farming in the region and women have few opportunities for paid work to help their families. This project allows them to work from home and keep local craft traditions alive. There is an article about this in the Autumn/ Winter Christian Aid magazine together with other pieces about Ukraine, South Sudan and Palestinian farmers around Bethlehem. The latter going to print before the horrendous Hamas attack on Southern Israel with the death of 1,400 Israeli children, women and men and the subsequent bombing of Gaza which has resulted in thousands of deaths of Palestinian children, women and men with no end to the war in sight. Donations can be made on the Christian Aid website towards the provision of humanitarian aid in Gaza or cheques can be sent to The Palestinian Appeal, Christian Aid, 35-41 Lower Marsh, London, SE1 7RL.

2023 has seen many natural disasters as well as the wars in Ukraine and Gaza with devastating earthquakes in Southern Turkey, North West Syria, Morocco and Afghanistan. Dreadful wild fires in many parts of the world, flooding in Greece and Libya all of which have meant that the aid agencies and charities are working at full stretch.

All are in need of donations to facilitate their work among the poorest communities in the world as well as responding to these unfolding humanitarian disasters. This is all at a time when many people are feeling the effects of rising costs of food and energy.

MAF (Mission Aviation Fellowship)

MAF flies vets to Kenya as climate change takes its toll

In the first ever African Climate Summit held in Nairobi, leaders across the continent are tackling the fallout from increasingly extreme weather. After months of drought followed by a deluge, Kenya alone has lost millions of livestock, which are the lifeblood of isolated farming communities. In Kenya, flash floods in May followed the country's worst drought in decades, which wiped out 2.6 million livestock.

Before the deluge, many pastures for animals and crops for human consumption shrivelled up in prolonged scorching heat. Natural watering holes evaporated. So many livestock simply perished from hunger and thirst, impacting livelihoods, food production, public health, migration, security, family life and education.

When the rain finally fell, the ground was too hard to absorb it, washing away fields and flooding farms and homes. Bridges destroyed by storms cut off entire communities.

MAF has been flying in volunteer vets to support pastoralists and their livestock in remote places where there are no vets and where people cannot afford treatment. This year – in partnership with 'Veterinarians with a Mission' (VMP) and 'Christ is the Answer Ministries' (CITAM) – MAF has flown scores of vets saving over 74,000 animals in Kenya.

Dr Josiah Mandieka, founder of Veterinarians with a Mission states;

"We meet people who need veterinary services but they can't afford it, or they live in communities where there are no veterinary surgeons. VMP's partnership with MAF ensures that livestock are taken care of, veterinarian services are provided and communities don't slide into abject poverty due to widespread death of animals, lack of knowledge or misuse of veterinary drugs."


As we look for a new church to join in our local area, we both wish St Columba's Hillhead, Philip and the combined church family every blessing for the years ahead.
